

Pompeii, Herculaneum & Classical Campania

Learn more about Pompeii at the recently excavated villas



Nowhere in the world gives deeper insight into Roman life than the dramatic seaside towns of Pompeii and Herculaneum. Before the cataclysmic eruption of Vesuvius these were thriving, lively seaside towns.

Pompeii was a trading town equipped with many bars, shops and brothels, while neighbouring Herculaneum was an affluent and elegant town. All this came to an abrupt halt, however, one autumnal day in AD 79, when Vesuvius - which had done little more than rumble for years - erupted with incredible force.

Two thousand years later, the sites of the Bay of Naples confront the modern visitor with a vivid, haunting immediacy like nothing else in the ancient world. In some cases we even know the names, professions and personal histories of the people who owned the villas and shops we visit. The preservation of Herculaneum, Pompeii and its surrounding sites is remarkable and the archaeology beyond compare, which is why we have been leading tours here for over 30 years. And this is an exciting time for visitors as new discoveries are being made and new houses opened. Walk with us as the Romans did, from amphitheatre to baths to forum, as our Guide Lecturer conjures an evocative picture of the everyday life of these prosperous Roman towns.

Day One | UK - Naples - Cava de' Tirreni

Today fly from London Heathrow to Naples and then we transfer to our hotel on arrival.

Day Two | Cava de' Tirreni - Paestum

Our day begins with a visit to the fascinating site at **Paestum**, ancient Poseidonia. Long before the Romans came, this was a thriving Greek city that was part of greater Greece from the 6th century BCE. After lunch, we visit the **Paestum Museum**, famed for its archaic metopes and its painted tombs. We also be able to visit the magnificent **Store Rooms** of Paestum.

Day Three | Pompeii

We devote the entire day to **Pompeii**. No other site compares in revealing details of daily life in a Roman town. We visit some of the most well-preserved buildings as well as an amphitheatre, theatre, forum, bath-houses, bars and even brothels. Fountains in the street are worn from where countless people rested their hands to take a drink and Roman graffiti can still be seen on the walls. Travelling via

the best routes to avoid the crowds, we visit some houses that are newly reopened to the public.

Day Four | Naples - Pozzuoli

Our first visit of the day is to the fabulous **National Archaeological Museum** in Naples, home to exceptional collections of artefacts. After lunch, we move on to **Pozzuoli** and visit one of the world's most impressive amphitheatres. Later, we are granted private access to the **Cave of Sejanus**, an impressive tunnel dating to the age of Augustus, which gives access to the lovely seaside villa of **Pausilypon**. During our visit here, we can see a theatre and odeon, built at a later date.

Day Five | Stabiae

Go off the beaten track today to the villas of **Stabiae**, an exclusive Roman resort for the very wealthy. The vast **Villa San Marco**, with its swimming pool and bath complex, is one of the most opulent along this coast and it remains very impressive in its scale. Subject to renovations being completed, we hope to visit the **Villa Arianna**,



with its wonderful frescoes and fabulous views over the Bay of Naples. After lunch we visit the Archaeological Museum of Castellammare di Stabia Libero D'Orsi which opened in September 2020 specifically for the exhibition of the many important items found in the region of Stabia. There are a large number of finds on display, some never before exhibited in Italy, including frescoes, inlaid floors, stuccoes, sculptures and tableware.

Day Six | Herculaneum

This morning we head to **Herculaneum**, which perfectly complements a visit to Pompeii. This seaside city was buried to a significantly greater depth than Pompeii - under 23 metres of pyroclastic to be exact - perfectly preserving every-day objects as well as houses up to their rooftops. In addition to the site, we explore

the Antiquarium, newly opened after 44 years, and which houses precious articles found along Herculaneum's sea front, including a wellpreserved boat. After lunch we visit Boscoreale to explore Villa Regina, discovered in the late 20th century while digging for the foundations of council housing. In contrast to the opulent villas we have seen on other days, this is a modest small holding which provides us with evidence of how ordinary people lived. Boscoreale is a locality north of Pompeii located on the slopes of Vesuvius, identified by some with the Pagus Augustus Felix Suburbanus. With the inauguration of the Great Pompeii, in October 2023, the Antiquarium of Boscoreale was reopened with a room dedicated to the excavations underway in the suburban villa of Civita Giuliana, with the ceremonial chariot found there in 2021.

Day Seven | Vesuvius - Oplontis

Today, we ascend to the great volcanic crater of Vesuvius. The majority of our journey is by bus, but the final part requires a short walk, which is well worth the effort. The walk starts at Monte Somma, the crater of the AD 79 eruption, where we grasp the scale of it. After the ascent and peering into the crater being forged since the ancient eruption, we will see fumaroles and the layers of previous eruptions, while walking around the perimeter of the crater affords magnificent views over the Bay of Naples. On good days, you can even make out Pompeii. After lunch, we continue on to the impressive villa at Oplontis, which boasts sumptuous frescoes, a bath complex, an enormous swimming pool and interesting slave quarters. This villa was supposedly owned by Emperor Nero and was both destroyed and subsequently preserved by Vesuvius' eruption.

Day Eight | Cava de' Tirreni - Naples - UK

After breakfast, our tour ends and we catch our return flight back to London Heathrow.

Day One | UK - Bologna

Today fly from London Heathrow to Bologna and transfer to our hotel.

Day Two | Bologna

Our journey begins in **Bologna** with a visit to the **Archaeological Museum** with its impressive array of artefacts, housed in the 15th-century Palazzo Galvani. We then proceed to **Salaborsa**, a multimedia library in Palazzo d'Accursio with a transparent floor revealing ancient excavations. Day Three | Ferrara

After breakfast, we explore Ferrara's treasures, beginning at the medieval Castello Estense, a moated fortress with towers, drawbridges and opulent rooms. Next, we visit the 12th-century Cattedrale San Giorgio and the National Archaeological Museum of Ferrara in Palazzo Costabili, renowned for its Etruscan artefacts from Spina. Post-lunch, our final stop is the Renaissance Palazzo Schifanoia, built for the Este family and home to significant 15th-century frescoes.

Day Four | Comacchio

Today, we head to Comacchio, 'Little Venice', with its scenic canals and bridges. We visit the **Museum of the Ancient Delta**, showcasing a **well-preserved Roman shipwreck** from the 1st century BCE. After

lunch, we drive back to Bologna, stopping at the 9th-century **Pomposa Abbey**, known for its Carolingian manuscripts.

Day Five | Modena

Today, we explore **Modena**, starting with its UNESCO-listed cathedral and a climb up **Ghirlandina Tower** for panoramic views. We then visit the Baroque **Ducal Palace** with its apartments adorned with frescoe. After lunch, we visit the **Mutina Archaeological Park**, revealing Roman-era roads and buildings.

Day Six | Parma

We visit **Parma**, renowned for art and cuisine. Highlights include Teatro Farnese, a 17th-century wooden theatre, and the **Baptistery**, made from pink Verona marble. The **adjacent cathedral** boasts Renaissance art, a marble pulpit and Correggio's grand frescoes. After lunch, we explore the **National Archaeological Museum**.

Day Seven | Villanova - Montale

We visit the Museum of Villanovan Civilisation in Castenaso, showcasing early Iron Age artefacts from the Villanovan culture. In Marzabotto, we explore the Etruscan city of Kainua at the Pompeo Aria National Etruscan Museum and then continue to the Bronze Age site of Terramare di Montale.

Prehistoric Italy



Throughout history, the fertile (and beautiful) Val Camonica valleys were an important route through the Italian Alps connecting northern and southern Europe. Prehistorians have theorised that the continuing movement of peoples and goods, especially during the Bronze and Iron Ages, gave rise to a dynamic prehistoric society – the history of which is packed into this ice-scoured landscape of lakes and mountains.

Enjoy a morning in Ledro on the scenic shores of the mountain lake as we study the well-preserved remains of a Bronze Age village

Day One | UK - Verona - Boario Terme

We fly to Verona and transfer to our hotel in Boario Terme.

Day Two | Val Camonica

We begin our survey of the extraordinary rock art with a two-day exploration of Val Camonica, starting with the incredible sites in Naquane Park. The valley is 75kms in length and contains more than 100,000 prehistoric rock art images depicting people, animals, tools and weapons. We continue with a visit to the huge Copper Age engraved boulders at Massi di Cemno. Excavations here uncovered a significant multi-period sanctuary. In the afternoon, we spend time in the National Museum of Prehistory della Val Camonica. Here, we see a marvellous collection of statue stelae and a wide range of finds from decades of excavations in the valley

Day Three | Val Camonica

Images: Petroglyphs in Trento & Bolzano

This morning, we visit the rock art sites in the archaeological park of **Seradina-Bedolini** showing scenes of hunting, war, magic an agriculture. After lunch, we contrast art with everyday domestic life as we view reconstructed prehistoric houses — and more rock art — at **Foppe di Nadro**. Here, we can see a Neolithic hut and also a Rhaetic Iron Age house, giving a good idea of how the people that made the rock art lived.

Day Four | Boario Terme - Lake Ledro - Trento

Today we make our way through the foothills of the Alps to the shores of beautiful Lake Ledro where a Bronze Age pile dwelling village (known as a palafitta) was discovered in 1929. We visit the **Pile Dwelling Museum** to see the finds from the site and view its reconstructed houses. The remarkable finds excavated from the lake village include baked bread moulded around heated stones. In the afternoon we continue to Riva del Garda and La Rocca Museum, where the exhibits include **Copper Age** statues.

Day Five | Bolzano & Trento

We drive further into the Alps and visit the **South Tyrol Museum of Archaeology in Bolzano**, home of Ötzi, the Ice Man. Scientists and archaeologists have unravelled (and continue to unravel) the tiniest details of his life during the Copper Age, 5,000 years ago. His body has yielded information on how he lived and what he ate, how his tattoos possibly indicate acupuncture points, how he survived and how he died. The original artefacts are very well displayed, along with the excellent reconstructions and are irresistibly fascinating. After lunch we return to Trento to visit the magnificent **Romanesque cathedral** and the excavations of a Roman street below one of its piazzas, the Bishop's Palace.

Day Six | Trento - Verona - UK

We make our way to Verona for our return flight to London Gatwick.

Capri & Romans on the Bay of Naples

New discoveries and highlights in the shadow of Vesuvius



Roman sites in the Bay of Naples have seen remarkable regeneration recently. This coastal area, developed by Roman elites for leisure, now features exciting archaeological activities and many newly opened sites. While Pompeii's new excavations get much attention, new sections of Herculaneum, Roman sites in Positano and Boscoreale, and Terzigno's excavations are noteworthy too. Including Capri, this tour offers a fresh perspective on Romans in the Bay of Naples, highlighting new discoveries and sites for an updated view of this ancient world. It's an ideal time to visit these towns near Vesuvius, with fewer crowds.

Day One | UK - Naples - Cava de Tirreni

Today fly from London Heathrow airport to Naples and then we transfer to our hotel on arrival.

Day Two | Positano & Amalfi

This morning, we travel to Positano to visit the Roman Villa and museum, featuring its splendid frescoes. Hidden beneath the church of Santa Maria Assunta, this villa maritima may have belonged to Posides, a gladiator freed by Emperor Claudius. After lunch, we journey along the Amalfi Coast to explore the Cathedral of St. Andrew, a 9th-century structure showcasing a blend of styles, from Arabic-Norman to Renaissance and Baroque. Highlights include 11th-century bronze doors, a Romanesque campanile adorned with majolica tiles, and the 13th-century Cloister of Paradise with its peristyle and frescoes.

Day Three | Pompeii

Our entire day is dedicated to **Pompeii**, a site unparalleled in illustrating Roman daily life. We explore remarkably preserved buildings, an amphitheatre, theatre, forum, bath-houses, bars, and brothels. Street fountains bear the marks of countless hands, and Roman graffiti adorns the walls. Navigating optimal routes to avoid crowds, we visit several newly reopened villas.

Day Four | Naples

We commence with a visit to the remarkable **Museum of Archaeology** in Naples, home to exquisite frescoes and mosaics from Vesuvian towns, including the Alexander Mosaic and paintings of Sappho. The newly reopened western wing showcases numerous finds from Campania's key sites. Post-lunch, we explore two captivating locations in Naples: **Santa Chiara**, with its 18th-century majolica tile cloisters, and **San Lorenzo Maggiore**, a late 13th-century Franciscan church built on the Roman Forum's basilica site.

Day Five | Baia & Pozzuoli

Our morning is filled with Roman waterworks, beginning at the impressive Piscina Mirabilis, a vast cistern for the fleet at Misenum. We proceed to Baia, developed in the Roman era for the super-rich seeking thermal springs. We visit the Archaeological Park, site of an imperial thermal and palatial complex. After lunch, we explore the Flavian amphitheatre in Pozzuoli, one of the ancient world's largest amphitheatres, featuring well-preserved service rooms.

Day Six | Herculaneum, Boscoreale & Terzigno

Today, we visit Herculaneum, buried by pyroclastic flow from the same eruption that engulfed Pompeii. The preservation of organic materials makes this site particularly poignant, showcasing a wine shop, the stunning House of the Stags, and fragments of daily life. New museums and the recently opened House of the Bicentenary enhance the experience. Following lunch in Herculaneum, we explore Boscoreale's Villa Regina, a modest holding revealing ordinary life. We conclude with the Museum of Archaeology at Terzigno, housing remains and frescoes from farms destroyed by the AD 79 earthquake.

Day Seven | Capri

This morning, we ferry from Naples to **Capri**, a captivating limestone island. Historically favoured by emperors and elites for leisure, Capri's charm persists. We visit Anacapri for panoramic views from Monte Solaro and explore **Villa San Michele**, with its gardens and vistas. The afternoon offers free time to explore before returning to Naples by ferry.

Day Eight | Cava de Tirreni - Naples - UK

Our tour concludes with a private visit to the Monastery of the Most Holy Trinity at Cava de Tirreni, housing 15,000 parchments dating back to the 8th century. We then proceed to the airport for our flight back to London Heathrow.

Classical Sicily

Rich archaeological sites and impressive artistic achievements



Some of the richest archaeological sites and the most impressive artistic achievements of European culture are to be found in Sicily, the largest island in a sea which was itself thought to lie at the centre of the ancient world, the Mediterranean. Controlling the trade routes between east and west and the pivot of power between the 'superpowers' of antiquity, Sicily was fought over and repeatedly won throughout the history of Western civilisation. As part of Magna Graecia, the city of Syracuse was second only to Athens and Carthaginians wrestled with Rome for control here during the first Punic War. This tour presents an extraordinary panorama of changing identities - Phoenician, Greek, Roman, Byzantine, Arab and Norman.

Day One | UK - Catania

Today fly from London and arrive in Catania before transferring to Palermo.

Day Two | Segesta & Monreale

We find the ancient Greek city of Segesta, home to an elegant but unfinished 5th-century BC Doric temple then we make our way to Monreale, the former hunting ground of the Norman kings of Sicily.

Day Three | Palermo

The wonders of Palermo awaits, from the Archaeological Museum, which houses significant collections of Punic and Ancient Greek art, to the beautifully decorated church of La Martorana and the neighbouring Chiesa di San Cataldo. Next is Palermo Cathedral and a private visit to the Cappella Palatina.

Day Four | Cefalù & Himara

Discover the charming little port of Cefalù. Later, we visit the archaeological park at Himera, the site of the legendary battle between the Greeks and Carthaginians in 480 BCE.

Day Five | Palermo - Motya - Marsala

This morning we drive to Marsala then cross by boat to the island of Motya. While on Motya we visit the Archaeological Museum, taking time to admire its world-renowned statue of the charioteer, a striking sculpture from the early 5th century BCE.

Day Six | Selinus

We start at the Cave di Cusa, used by Selinus for their titanic temples. Their heavy work was abandoned in 409 BC when Carthaginians mercilessly sacked their city, a common refrain in the violent history of Sicily. We then travel on to Selinus and finish at the Acropolis of Selinus.

Day Seven | Agrigento

Images: Doric temple of Segesta

We explore the remains of Agrigento today, the

site of the ancient Greek city of Akragas and take in the Valley of the Temples, a World Heritage Site of seven Doric sanctuaries. We also view the remains of the Temple of Olympian Zeus, another Sicilian temple, with an unusual layout characterised by enormous telemons.

Day Eight | Piazza Armerina - Morgantina -Ortygia

Our journey takes us through central Sicily, stopping at the magnificent Villa Romana del Casale in Piazza Armerina before we travel to Morgantina, a city founded by the native Sikels under their leader **Ducetius**

Day Nine | Syracuse

Today is all about Syracuse, which Cicero described as "the greatest Greek city and the most beautiful of them all". Highlights include the Neapolis Archaeological Park, home to the Great Theatre where Aeschylus' tragedies were once performed, before a walk around **Ortygia**, the city's oldest part.

Day Ten | Ortygia & Noto

Enjoy time exploring the wonderful island of Ortygia this morning. Later, we proceed to Noto, a baroque fantasy of a city, now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This afternoon we visit the late Roman villa at Tellaro, which contains fine mosaics depicting scenes such as the ransom of Hector's body.

Day Eleven | Ortygia - Catania - Taormina

This morning we drive to Catania and the Piazza del Duomo, Catania's principal square and a UNESCO World Heritage site. We will also visit the Roman Theatre and Odeon. After lunch, we drive to Taormina to visit the superbly situated Roman theatre.

Day Twelve | Catania - UK

We return to Catania for our flight back to London Gatwick.

For three hundred years the hardy peoples of central Italy were Rome's bitterest enemies. Rome fought three wars against the tenacious mountaineers who had a habit of humiliating Roman generals. We travel to the ancient site of **Venafro** on the River Volturno, famous for its olive groves, and explore the remains of its amphitheatre, which once held 15,000 spectators.

The day starts with a visit to the Santa Chiara National Archaeological Museum which houses finds from Venafrum and the abbey of San Vincenzo. We discover the Pandone Castle, originally built in the 10th century, on the remains of earlier fortifications and redecorated in the Renaissance and then visit San Vincenzo al

Day Three | Isernia & Saepinum

We explore Isernia, a strategic Samnite city renamed Aesernia after its seizure by Rome, then visit the National Museum of the Paleolithic, which displays the amazing Palaeolithic finds from the area. We continue to the Cathedral and the Civic Museum of Memory and History before driving onwards to Saepinum.

Day Four | Pietrabbondate & Schiavi di Abruzzo

We drive to Agnone, famed for its bronze casting tradition and the location of a Papal bell foundry that has been making bells for generations and then move on to Pietrabbondate to explore the excavated remains of the ritual sanctuary

of the Pentri tribe. Later we drive to Schiavi di Abruzzo where we see another mountain sanctuary which boasts two well-preserved and reconstructed temples.

Day Five | Venafro - Silvi Marina

Today we venture into the Abruzzi mountains to **luvanum**, a market town established for the ancient shepherds of the uplands. We cross the Sangro River to the Rocca Scalegna and visit the Angevin castle, which was built during its conflict with the Aragonese. We then head to Chieti to visit the National Museum Villa Frigerj whose highlights include the extraordinary Capestrano Warrior.

Day Six | Silvi Marina - L'Aqulia

The day starts in Sulmona, where we visit the sanctuary of Hercules Curino, one of the most important ancient shrines of Abruzzo before we proceed to the UNESCO-listed Oratory of San Pellegrino in **Bominaco**, a Benedictine Carolingian chapel. We then visit Fossa, where a unique Samnite tumulus cemetery is criss-crossed with rows of standing stones.

Day Seven | L'Aquila - Aminternum - UK

On our last day, we pay a quick visit to L'Aquila. Here we visit the famous fountain of the 99 spouts, gifted to the city by Emperor Frederick II. Then on to Aminternum, a substantial Roman city whose remains include a theatre and amphitheatre.





The cultural landscape of Veneto



While Rome commands attention with its imperial grandeur and Florence dazzles with its Medici legacy, Verona quietly offers something increasingly rare: a picturesque medieval quarter, well preserved Roman sites and dozens of beautiful churches blissfully light on tourists when travelling in the early part of the year. We explore its ancient heart and make excursions into the region beyond, an area which bears the accumulated weight of centuries—Roman theatres, Palladian villas and medieval communes that grew into maritime powers.

Visit Sirmione the beautiful lakeside town which sits on a peninsula of Lake Garda

Day One | UK - Verona

We fly from London Gatwick to Verona.

Day Two | Verona

We spend the day exploring Verona's Roman heritage, starting with the magnificent amphitheatre. We then visit three subterranean archaeological sites, beginning with Via San Cosimo, which preserves evidence of Verona's early defences and an imperial-age domus. Next, we see the Arco dei Gavi, a Roman arch marking the start of the Via Postumia, and the Porta Borsari, the gateway to the Roman city. Before lunch, we visit the Cryptoporticus of Corte Sgarzerie. In the afternoon, we explore the Teatro Romano, built in the 1st century BCE on San Pietro hill.

Day Three | Sirmione

We drive to **Sirmione**, a stunning lakeside town on Lake Garda's peninsula. Here, we visit the 14thcentury Castello Scaligero, named after the Della Scala dynasty. A small train takes us to Villa Catullus, northern Italy's largest Roman villa, designed to maximise lake views. In the afternoon, we visit Desenzano Roman Villa, once a grand property, now famous for its vivid mosaic floors depicting cupids, maenads, satyrs, wild beasts, and the seasons.

Day Four | Verona

We explore Verona's connections to the powerful de Scala family. Our morning begins at Chiesa San Fermo, known for its dual structure and frescoes, followed by Chiesa Santa Anastasia, Verona's largest church and a Gothic masterpiece. We finish with a stroll through Piazza dei Signori, the political hub

during the Scalliger era. The afternoon is free to explore Verona or take a fast train to Milan or Venice.

Day Five | Brescia

Today, we travel to **Brescia**, a city rich in history. We visit the Archaeological Park, featuring the bronze Winged Victory, the Capitolium, Roman Theatre, and Republican Sanctuary. We also explore the Longobard complex of San Salvatore-Santa Giulia and the Museo Santa Giulia. The afternoon is free for independent exploration before returning to Verona.

Day Six | Padua

We take the train to Padua and start with the famous Scrovengi Chapel, home to Giotto's revolutionary frescoes. Next, we visit the **Museum** Eremitani, housing Egyptian artefacts brought by Belzoni. In the afternoon, we explore the Palazzo della Ragione, the Baptistery of the Cathedral, and the Anatomical Theatre, where Galileo once taught.

Day Seven | Vicenza

We travel to UNESCO-listed Vicenza. Our first stop is the Roman Cryptoporticus beneath Piazza Duomo. We then see the Basilica Palladiana, transformed by Palladio, the Loggia del Capitaniato, and the Palladio Museum. After lunch, we admire Giovanni Bellini's works in Chiesa Santa Corona and visit Palladio's Palace of Chiericati, now a museum. We end the day at Teatro Olimpico, Palladio's stunning Renaissance theatre.

Essential ETRUSCANS

Ancient people of Tuscany



The Etruscans are one of the great forgotten civilisations. Conquest by the Romans meant that the Etruscans only appeared as incidental participants in early histories, but they had in fact flourished throughout the first millennium BCE in a group of prosperous city states which were sophisticated, cosmopolitan and influential. Their settlements, their artefacts and even their cemeteries testify to this and as we travel through the lovely countryside of Tuscany and northern Lazio, the Etruscans are abundantly on show, if you know where to look.

Discover the beautifully painted tombs of Tarquinia with scenes of dancers, musicians and fabulous beasts

Day Two | Orvieto

We explore **Orvieto**, perched on a high tuff plateau typical of southern Etruscan cities. In the morning, we visit the Belvedere temple podium and two archaeological museums. Terracotta roof decorations from the Belvedere temple are displayed in the main museum, while the Museo Claudio Faina, a private collection in a charming town house, retains some original furnishings. The afternoon is free for independent exploration. Optional visits include 'underground' Orvieto, with its tuff plateau honeycombed with tunnels, silos, and wells from various periods. Other options include St. Patrizio's Renaissance well and the spectacular duomo – the 'Golden Lily of Cathedrals'.

Day Three | Bolzarno & Chiusi

In the morning, we visit the extraordinary Bosco Sacro de Bomarzo, commissioned in 1552 by Prince Pier Francesco Orsini. This unique Mannerist garden intrigues visitors with enigmatic symbolism and dark romanticism, featuring grotesque stone monsters like dragons, giants, elephants, and the famous Orcus mouth – a massive stone face visitors can walk through. In the afternoon, we travel to Chiusi, renowned as the city of Lars Porsenna, the Etruscan King who nearly captured Rome. Its excellent **archaeological museum** showcases Etruscan urns, from early 'canopic' forms to later chests with sculpted reclining figures.

Day Four | Orvieto

Today is free to explore Orvieto or relax. From here, it's easy to take a train to nearby towns or cities. Alternatively, you can opt for an unguided excursion to Siena, one of the most renowned Tuscan Renaissance city-states.

Day Five | Orvieto - Tarquinia

Before leaving **Orvieto**, we visit the small Etruscan Crocifisso del Tufo cemetery, laid out on a grid with family names carved above each tomb entrance. We continue to Tarquinia, known in antiquity as 'Tarchuna' and one of the most powerful Etruscan states. Our first stop is the Archaeological Museum in a Renaissance palazzo, housing an excellent collection of Etruscan artifacts. After lunch, we explore painted tombs at Monterozzi cemetery, dating from the 6th-1st centuries BCE, with scenes of banquets, music, dancing, and athletic games honouring the dead.

Day Six | Sutri & Villa Giulia Museum

We visit the archaeological park at Sutri, located on a volcanic plateau overlooking the Via Cassia. Its monuments, carved into tufa rock, have been preserved for millennia. In the afternoon, we head to Rome's outskirts to visit the Villa Giulia Museum, home to one of the finest collections of Etruscan artifacts, including life-size terracotta figures from the Portonaccio temple at Veio and the famous sarcophagus of the married couple from Cerveteri. We then return to our hotel in Tarquinia.

Day Seven | Cerveteri - Rome - UK

We drive down the coast to Cerveteri and spend the morning at the atmospheric Banditaccia cemetery, a 'city of the dead' with streets lined

with vast tumuli and tombs resembling terraced houses. Some tombs feature rock-carved furniture, and one displays painted stucco household items and pets. The ancient heart of southern Sicily



With a history stretching back almost 3,000 years, the city of Syracuse has the rare accolade of being classed as a World Heritage Site in its entirety. Founded in 734 BCE, the city grew to become the most powerful Greek polis in the western Mediterranean, rivalling Athens in its cultural achievements and political influence. We follow in the footsteps of the Greeks, Romans and much later civilizations who landed upon these shores and discover not only Ortygia but surrounding sites including the Greek Castle of Euryalus, the Roman Villa at Tellaro and the lovely Pantalica hills, honeycombed with ancient tombs.

Day One | UK - Catania - Syracuse

We fly from London Gatwick to Catania and drive to our hotel in Syracuse.

Day Two | Ortygia

We cross to the mainland to visit the very fine Paolo Orsi Museum, boasting collections discovered throughout eastern Sicily. Next, we explore Neapolis Archaeological Park, meaning "New City" in Greek and representing the expansion of ancient Syracuse. We explore the archaeological area surrounding the theatre and the vast stone quarries, the amphitheatre and the Altar of Zeus. Later we return to Ortygia to visit the extensive catacombs lying beneath Basilica of San Giovanni.

Day Seven | Villa Romana del Casale

We drive to Piazza Armerina to see the restored UNESCO-listed **Villa Romana del Casale** with its exceptionally fine mosaics dating from the 4th century. The many rooms of exquisite mosaics floors, from a famous hunt scene and a scene of ten maidens participating in gymnastics to an array of vivid scenes from mythology.

Next, we visit Kerameikos, named in ancient times after the hero Keramos, son of Dionysus and Ariadne, where an extensive cemetery was excavated during the 19th and early 20th centuries. After lunch we visit the National Museum of

Athens. Now somewhat overlooked by visitors flocking to the Acropolis Museum, it is worth remembering that this older museum is still home to a great collection of antiquities.

Day Four | Athens - UK

In the morning, we travel to Piraeus, which once consisted of three separate harbours - Kantharos, Zea and Munichia. All three harbours are still used today but since the sea level has risen two metres since antiquity, many of the ancient installations of Piraeus are now underwater. Excavations still continue, however, and notable finds have included several bronze statues, perhaps the most famous being of Apollo now in the Piraeus Archaeological Museum. Later today we board our return flight to London Gatwick.

The layout of the modern city still carries echoes of both the original Greek polis and the later Roman town – it is fascinating to trace them amongst the busy buildings of modern Athens. Day One | UK – Athens

We fly from London Gatwick to Athens and transfer to our hotel in the heart of the city.

Day Two | Athens

We start with a walk through ancient Athens, passing the Theatre of Dionysus and the impressive remains of the Odeon of Herodes Atticus, before climbing to the Acropolis. Here, the Parthenon stands tall, once housing a colossal gold and ivory statue of Athena, the city's patron goddess. After lunch, we visit the acclaimed Acropolis Museum, with its stunning Parthenon Gallery on the top floor. The gallery mirrors the dimensions and orientation of the Parthenon and showcases surviving sculptures, including frieze sections of the Panathenaic procession, alongside plaster casts of pieces held in other museums like the British Museum.

Day Three | Athens

Today, we explore the Greek Agora, the bustling heart of ancient Athenian life from the 6th century BCE, where citizens traded, debated, and engaged in democracy. Philosophers like Socrates famously debated here. Next, we visit the Roman Forum, built during Julius Caesar's reign and completed under Augustus. Highlights include the Tower of the Winds, an octagonal marble clocktower that served as a sundial and water clock. The afternoon is free for personal exploration of Athens' monuments or museums.

Day Four | Delphi

We travel north to **Delphi**, a 3-4 hour journey to a spectacular mountain sanctuary. Chosen for its natural rock cleft emitting vapours believed to aid communication with Apollo, Delphi thrived from the 8th century BCE through Roman times. Pilgrims, city-states, and rulers sought divine guidance here, and the site features the Temple of Apollo, a theatre, stadium, and treasuries built by Greek city-states.

Day Five | Athens

We visit the National Archaeological Museum, home to treasures spanning over 5,000 years. Highlights include the gold funeral Mask of Agamemnon in the Mycenaean Room and the Cycladic collection's minimalist marble figurines, which inspired modern artists like Picasso. These sculptures, created between 3200 and 2000 BCE, showcase the ancient roots of artistic abstraction. The afternoon is free for further exploration.

Day Six | Athens - UK

On our final day, we visit **The Temple of Poseidon** at Sounion, perched on Cape Sounion's dramatic headland. Built c. 440 BCE, this Doric masterpiece of white marble glows against the azure Saronic Gulf, offering one of Greece's most breathtaking views. After the visit, we head to the airport for our afternoon flight home to London Gatwick.

East of Thessaloniki are the mountains and plains of Thrace. Its ancient kingdoms were alternately at war and allied with Persians, Greeks and Macedonians. Discover the strategic cities that grew up in the wake of passing conquerors of Phillipi, explore Mesembria with its Romano-Thracian chariot burials and catch a glimpse of the city of Amphipolis. Thrace's landmark archaeological sites and Byzantine, medieval and Ottoman monuments add to its rich cultural heritage. This wild land is notable for the peaceful coexistence of Christian and Muslim traditions.

Day One | UK - Thessaloniki - Kavala

This morning, we arrive in Thessaloniki and drive to Kavala visiting, en route, the great Athenian colony of Amphipolis, site of a battle between Athens and Sparta during the Peloponnesian war. We explore remains of a necropolis, a gymnasium as well as houses dating from the Roman period.

Day Two | Kavala - Philippi

Today we explore the **Archaeological Museum in** Kavala, which houses remains from Amphipolis and other ancient sites found nearby. We visit the UNESCO-listed Macedonian and Roman colony of Philippi and explore the forum and well-preserved theatre. Later, we return to Kavala, where we see the Byzantine Castle.

Day Three | Thasos

We make our way to Keramoti port and continue by ferry to the Island of Thasos, the most northerly of all Greek islands surrounded by the crystal-clear waters of the Aegean Sea. We spend the day exploring the excavated remains of the classical city which once lay under modern-day Limenas and visit the Limenas Museum.

Day Four | Abdera, Xanthi & Komotini

Take the day to explore the site of ancient Abdera, with links to Phoenicians and important scholars, including the Sophist Protagoras and historian Hecataeus. We continue to Xanthi, known for its distinctive period architecture and then end the day with a visit to Komotini.

Day Five | Kavala - Samothrace

On the island of Samothrace, we drive up to the Chora set high up on Mount Saos and visit its citadel built by the Galluzi family in the 14th century when Venice controlled large parts of the Aegean. After lunch, we check into our hotel with some free time to relax after our early start or you may wish to join an optional walk in Fonias Gorge.

Day Six | Samothrace - Alexandroupoli

We explore the famous classical 'Sanctuary of **the Gods**,' one of the most important religious complexes in Greece, set up in honour of the 'Great Gods'. We visit the small site museum which presents exhibits from the Sanctuary.

Day Seven | Mesembria & Maroneia

Uncover the ruins at Mesembria, situated on the coast near the mouth of the stream Shabla Dere, now identified as the ancient Greek polis of **Zoni**. Later, visit the Archaeological Museum containing more than 1,000 ancient objects excavated from the archaeological sites around Alexandroupoli, Evros and the wider region of Thrace.

Day Eight | Didymoteicho & Evros Delta

We travel north to **Didymoteicho** and explore some of the fortifications and remains of Byzantine houses as well as the small church of St Catherine. In the afternoon we take a boat trip on the Evros, a river associated with a number of Greek myths.

Day Nine | Alexandroupoli - Thessaloniki

Museum of Eleutherna in Rethymnon, which displays finds from Eletherna.

Day Five | Knossos & Archanes

This morning, we visit the world-famous site of Knossos, which boasted a population of 100,000 at its height in the 18th century BCE and was settled as early as the 7th millennium. Later today we visit two important museums, the Archaeological Museum of Archanes and the exceptional Heraklion Museum, with its exquisite jewellery and brightly coloured wall paintings.

Day Six | Ayia Triadha & Gortyn

We start our day at the site of Ayia Triada, a grand but ruinous Bronze Age villa. Next, we proceed to Phaistos, inhabited from the 5th millennium BCE, it is the site of two palaces from different periods which were abandoned by the Mycenaean period. Afterwards, we visit Gortyn in the verdant Messara Valley and the Archaeological Museum of Messara.

Day Seven | Gournia & Mochlos

Today we visit the Palace of Malia, a huge Minoan complex just north of the Lasithi Mountains, significant not only for its size, but also its strategic port and grand facades. We then proceed to the well-preserved late Minoan town of Gournia, one of the few sites in the region to have been fully excavated. After lunch, we go by boat to the tiny island of Mochlos, which may have been connected to the island in the Minoan period.

Day Eight | Heraklion - UK

We transfer to Heraklion Airport for our flight to London Gatwick.



Day Ten | Ephesus & Selçuk

Day One | UK – Larnaca - Kyrenia

Day Two | Kyrenia

Kyrenia Harbour, a well-preserved medieval port with a Roman-era horseshoe-shaped basin fortified by the Lusignans, awaits our morning stroll. 

Highlights of Shetland & Orkney

From standing stones to chambered cairns







The islands beyond the northernmost tip of Scotland glory in some of the most beautiful and rugged landscapes in the world. For more than five thousand years they have been home to farmers and fishermen, who left monuments so impressive that this has been called an archaeologists' paradise.



Visit sites at the cutting edge of archaeological research which is shedding light on every aspect of Stone Age life

Discover five World Heritage sites at Old Scatness, Mousa Broch, Skara Brae, Jarlshof and the Ring of Brodgar

Day One | Lerwick

We meet at our hotel in Shetland at the Lerwick Hotel, before an introductory lecture and dinner together at the hotel.

Day Two | Mousa Broch & Jarlshof

Our journey into Shetland's archaeological wonders begins at Mousa Broch on the uninhabited island and RSPB reserve bearing its name, just off Shetland's mainland. After disembarking at the jetty, a short walk along the shore leads us to the broch, an imposing structure standing 13 metres tall and built around 3000 BCE. Originally featuring wooden floors, accessible by stairways still intact, this site is a testament to ancient ingenuity. Post-lunch, we visit the South Voe Croft Museum, providing insight into rural Shetland life, and conclude our day at Jarlshof, a site rich with 4,000 years of history.

Day Three Unst

Today's adventure takes us to Unst, the UK's northernmost inhabited island, where we explore its Viking heritage. With at least 60 Viking longhouses discovered here, it holds the largest concentration outside Scandinavia. We visit the **Underhoull** site, where excavations reveal the evolution of a longhouse with outhouses, annexes and drains, possibly featuring a mezzanine level. Our journey continues to Haroldswick to see the Skidbladner replica ship and reconstructed longhouse. The afternoon drive towards Skaw offers a view of the Muckle Flugga lighthouse at Unst's northern tip. Before returning by ferry, we explore Muness Castle, a 16th-century tower house abandoned in the 18th century after destruction by French pirates.

Day Four | Scatness

Our morning at **Scatness** reveals an Iron Age broch and village occupied for nearly two millennia, discovered during Sumburgh Airport's expansion. After lunch in Lerwick, we visit Clickhimin Iron Age **Broch** and wheelhouse, followed by a drive to the Scord of Brouster, a Neolithic farm site excavated in the 1970s. We continue to Stanydale Temple, an extraordinary structure resembling Malta's megalithic temples, with origins between 2500-2000 BCE.

Day Five | Lerwick - St. Ninian's Isle - Kirkwall

On our final Shetland day, we explore St. Ninian's Isle, walking across a striking sand spit to the Church, site of a Pictish silver hoard. We then visit Scalloway Museum, showcasing the WWII Shetland Bus operation. After lunch in Lerwick, we tour the Shetland Museum, home to over 3,000 artefacts, and later board the ferry to Kirkwall.

Day Six | Kirkwall & Ness of Brodgar

We explore Kirkwall on foot, visiting the Orkney Museum, Bishop's and Earl's Palace and St Magnus' Cathedral. After lunch, a short drive takes us to the Ness of Brodgar, where excavations have uncovered Neolithic structures and artwork. We end the day at the Ring of Brodgar, a stone circle henge monument.

Day Seven | Gurness Broch & Skara Brae

Our exploration begins at Gurness Broch, featuring an 8-metre tower surrounded by stone dwellings and defences. We visit the Brough of Birsay, accessible by causeway at low tide, with Norse settlement remains and a 12th-century church. Our day concludes at **Skara Brae**, a well-preserved Neolithic village offering a glimpse into ancient Orkney life.

Day Eight | Churchill's Barriers & Maeshowe

We drive south across Churchill's Barriers, vital causeways linking island communities, created by Italian POWs during WWII. Returning, we visit the Italian Chapel before heading to Stromness for its museum's exhibition on the Cairns project. In the afternoon, we explore Maeshowe, a magnificent chambered cairn illuminated by midwinter sun, while alternating visits with the Stones of Stennes.

We gather at our hotel in London this afternoon to begin our journey. First, we visit the **British** Museum to explore the Roman Britain galleries. Highlights include the Vindolanda tablets, offering a glimpse into life in a Roman auxiliary fort, and the exquisite Bacchic silver platter from the Mildenhall treasure hoard.

Day Two | London - Chichester

Today, we visit two splendid Roman residences. Starting at Bignor Roman Villa, we explore its well-preserved rooms and bathhouse, showcasing England's finest Roman mosaics. In the afternoon, we head to Fishbourne Roman Palace, a vast complex with mosaic floors, hypocaust heating, and formal gardens, likely owned by Tiberius Claudius Togidubnus, a pro-Roman British king.

Day Three | Chichester - Blandford Forum

Heading west, we visit Portchester Castle, a key Saxon Shore fort built in the 3rd century AD. Next, we explore Maiden Castle, a monumental Iron Age hill fort with immense earthworks. Our day ends at **Dorset Museum**, showcasing finds from Sir Mortimer Wheeler's 1930s excavations.

Day Four | Blandford Forum - Bath

We visit Hod Hill, an Iron Age hill fort adapted by the Romans during Vespasian's invasion. Continuing north, we reach **Bath** to explore the Roman Baths, built around natural hot springs revered by the Durotriges tribe long before Roman arrival.

Day Five | Bath - Caerleon - Chester

Crossing into Wales, we visit Caerleon, one of three permanent Roman legionary fortresses in Britain. In the afternoon, we drive to Wroxeter, exploring the remains of Viriconium, one of Roman Britain's largest cities.

Day Six | Chester - Carlisle

In Chester, we visit Deva Victrix, a vital Roman fortress and base for the Twentieth Legion. Highlights include the amphitheatre and Grosvenor Museum. Later, we head north, stopping at Ribchester Roman Museum in the Ribble Valley.

Day Seven | Vindolanda & Corbridge

We explore the Stanegate frontier, visiting Vindolanda, renowned for its preserved wooden writing tablets, and the nearby Roman site of Corbridge, with its fascinating museum.

Day Eight | Houseteads & Chesters

Today, we explore Hadrian's Wall. Starting at Housesteads Roman Fort, we walk to Milecastle 37 before visiting the Temple of Mithras at Carrawburgh and Chesters, the most complete Roman cavalry fort in Britain.

Day Nine | Carlisle - Edinburgh

Crossing into Scotland, we stop at **Trimontium** Museum, showcasing finds from Trimontium, a major Roman frontier post. Arriving in Edinburgh, we visit the National Museum of Scotland.

Day Ten | Cramond & Edinburgh

We explore the **Antonine Wall**, visiting **Callander** Park, Kinneil, Rough Castle with its unique lilia pits, and Bar Hill, the highest fort on the wall.



We meet in the afternoon for a visit to **Warwick Castle**, home of the powerful Beauchamp earls of Warwick and Richard Neville, 'the Kingmaker'. We see the interesting additions made to the castle by Richard III, the Bear and Clarence towers, showing the king's interest in artillery. In the evening we enjoy an introductory lecture on Richard III at our hotel.

Day Two | Stony Stratford & Fotheringhay

We make a morning stop at **Stony Stratford**, where Richard took possession of Edward V in 1483, and then lunch at **Delapré Abbey**, discussing the significance of the battle of Northampton (1460), which took place in the abbey grounds. In the afternoon we visit **Fotheringhay Church**, mausoleum of Richard III's family, the house of York.

We also discover the remains of the castle, where Richard was born in 1452, and the scene of the trial and execution of Mary Queen of Scots.

Day Three | Leicester

We make a morning visit to **Bosworth Battlefield Centre**, the fateful clash that brought the Wars of the Roses to an end with Richard III's death and the accession of the first Tudor king, Henry VII. In the afternoon we travel to Leicester's **King Richard III Visitor Centre**, which tells the story of the discovery of his remains, and the **Cathedral**, where we see his striking new tomb.

Day Four | Warwick

In the morning we enjoy a **walking tour of Warwick**, taking in more of its fascinating medieval history, followed by a concluding talk on Richard III.

Anglesey, or Ynys Môn as it is known in Welsh, holds a significant position in the archaeological and historical narrative of Britain. Separated from mainland Wales by the narrow Menai Strait, this tiny island off the northwest coast boats significant concentrations of Neolithic burial chambers, Bronze Age standing stones, and Iron Age hillforts. It was also at the centre of the dramatic encounter between Celtic druids and Roman legions that Tacitus so vividly recorded.

Day One | Bangor

We meet at our hotel in Bangor in time for an introductory talk before dinner.

Day Two | Bryn Celli Ddu & Caer Gybi

This morning, we drive across the Menai Bridge onto Anglesey and visit Bryn Celli Ddu. This impressive Neolithic passage grave continues to fascinate archaeologists because it is actually two monuments, one built on top of an earlier henge. Next, we have arranged access to Barclodiad y Gawres, a decorated chambered tomb. Its location in Anglesey makes it very unusual - tombs of this type are usually only found in Ireland. We continue to Ty Mawr stopping en route to view Llyn Cerrig Bach, an area of marshland (once a natural lake) and the location of the largest iron age hoard discovered to date in Wales. At Ty Mawr we see the remains of about 20 or so round stone houses. stores, and workshops. This site is remarkably well preserved, given that parts of it are 4,000 years old. After lunch we drive to Caer Gybi and view the remains of a small Roman fort. It is one of Europe's only three-walled Roman forts, the fourth side protected by the sea.

Day Three | Dina Dnille & Caernarfon

We visit some interesting fortifications today starting with Dinas Dnille Hillfort an Iron Age prehistoric coastal fort. The constantly eroding soft cliffs have long made it a challenging site to excavate but a monumental stone-built

roundhouse was discovered here a few metres from the cliff edge. Next, we visit Segontium Roman Fort which once formed a critical part of Roman control over the newly conquered Welsh tribes. Coins recovered from excavations show its remarkable longevity - it was garrisoned until around AD 394 and continued to play a part in the defence of the Welsh coast against Irish raiders and pirates. In the afternoon we explore magnificent Caernarfon Castle, one of the greatest buildings of the Middle Ages.

Day Four | Beaumaris Castle & Din Lligwy

We return to Anglesey this morning to visit Beaumaris Castle, the last of the royal strongholds created by Edward I. Designed to be even greater than Caernarfon with concentric rings of formidable defences, six great towers and hundreds of arrow loops, it was never completed. We continue to **Penmon Priory** established in the 6th century with the founding of a monastery by St. Seiriol, a prominent figure in Welsh history. There are well-preserved monastic remains, including a church that still serves as the parish, and a 10th-century cross with intricate carvings. Our last site visit of the day is to **Din Lligwy**, an excellent example of a fortified hut group, dating from the latter days of the Roman occupation.

Day Five | Bangor

Our tour comes to an and end and we check out of our hotel to make our way home.

Day One | UK - Dublin

We take a flight from London Heathrow to Dublin Airport and transfer to **Fourknocks**, home to a remarkable example of a passage tomb. This ancient burial site is preserved under a concrete dome, with carefully placed lighting apertures to show the unusual decoration to good effect. The remains of at least sixty individuals were found here and grave goods included stone and bone pendants and beads, as well as bone pins. After exploring this site, we continue to our hotel in Dublin for one night.

Day Two | Dublin - Drogheda

Our journey in Dublin, rich in Viking history, begins at the **Old Library of Trinity College**, home to the 9th-century Book of Kells. We then visit the 12th-century **St Patrick's Cathedral**, a key medieval landmark. After lunch, we explore the **National Museum of Ireland**, featuring Bronze Age gold, the 4,500-year-old Lurgan longboat, and preserved Iron Age bogland remains. The day concludes as we travel to our hotel in Drogheda.

Day Three | Newgrange & Knowth

Following breakfast, we head to **Newgrange**, a monumental Neolithic burial mound older than Stonehenge and the Pyramids of Giza. A distinctive feature is a stone box in the roof, allowing the winter solstice sun to illuminate the passage and rear chamber, showcasing the Neolithic builders' astronomical and engineering prowess. We then proceed to **Knowth**, a UNESCO-listed Neolithic site with two passage graves, one featuring a cruciform terminal chamber. Adorned with over three hundred decorated stones, Knowth is a significant repository of megalithic art, displaying spirals and serpentine forms. Later, we visit the **Hill of Tara**, historically the seat of Ireland's High Kings, and view the **Stone of**

Destiny, an emblem of ancient monarchy.

Day Four | Drogheda - Sligo

Our day begins at the passage grave cemetery at **Loughcrew**, or Slieve na Callighe, where we see Ireland's oldest monuments. Cairn T, aligned with equinox sunrises, features the Hag's Chair, likely used for Catholic Mass during penal times. We continue to Sligo, a coastal town with a history as a bustling trade hub visited by Phoenicians, Greeks and Romans. Post-lunch, we explore Creevykeel, an excellent example of an Irish Court Tomb, designed for social events involving large gatherings.

Day Five | Carrowmore & Carrowkeel

Today's highlight is Carrowmore, Ireland's oldest prehistoric cemetery, notable for its monuments clustered around Listoghil, a chamber tomb containing inhumations. These tombs were reused for burials during the Bronze and Iron Ages.

After lunch, we visit the Drumanone dolmen and proceed to the Carrowkeel megalithic complex. The scenic one-mile walk to this atmospheric site offers stunning views over Sligo Bay and Knocknarea Hill.

Day Six | Sligo - Rathcroghan - Galway

Our journey to Galway, located at the mouth of the River Corrib, includes a stop at Rathcroghan, the former Connachta capital. This unique archaeological landscape, mentioned in early Irish manuscripts, spans from the Neolithic to the early medieval periods with burial mounds and ringforts. In Galway, we visit the Galway City Museum's Prehistoric collection.

Day Seven | Inis Mor

On our final full day, we ferry to **Inis Mor**, one of the Arran islands, where wild landscapes contrast

The island of Malta might be small but it certainly packs a big punch in historical terms. In the struggle for dominion of the Mediterranean it has played a key role in centuries of sparring between the east and west. Enduring occupation from the Phoenicians, Romans, Greeks, Arabs, Normans, Sicilians, Hospitallers, French, and British, it has a colourful and complex heritage. Our focus, however, is on its earliest and most extraordinary occupation when some 5000 years ago this tiny archipelago was home to an astonishing culture which created elaborate stone temples and rock cut tombs.

Explore the cave and associated museum at Ghar Dalam Cave, the lowest layers of which are over 500,000 years old

Day One | UK - Valletta

We fly to Malta from London Heathrow and transfer to our hotel in Valletta for our first dinner together as a group.

Day Two | Mgarr & Mdina

Beginning in the town of Mgarr, we visit the two conjoined temples of Ta' Haġrat and Mġarr. We continue to the village site of **Skorba**, which has significantly contributed to our understanding of early Maltese prehistory. We spend the afternoon in Mdina - The Silent City - which served as the island capital from antiquity through to the Medieval period.

Day Three | Valletta

A day spent exploring **Valetta** on foot. We begin with the exceptional array of artefacts from Malta's unique prehistoric periods in the Archaeological Museum from man's first arrival on the island, up to the end of the Bronze Age. We also visit St. John's Cathedral and the Grand Master's Palace with facades of some of the many Auberges of the

Day Four | Haġar-Qim, Mnajdra & Tarxien

Today we visit the magnificent temple sites at Haġar-Qim and Mnajdra. These megalithic structures sit clustered close together at the top of a promontory with superb views over the sea. The internal arrangement of Hagar-Qim is highly complex involving what are probably many building and reconstruction phases and the lower temple at Mnajdra is astronomically aligned. In the afternoon, access permitting, we explore the Hal Saflieni Hypogeum, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Nearby, we will visit Tarxien megalithic site, one of the most elaborate of all the Megalithic temples on the island which has undergone extensive excavation and restoration.

Day Five | Għar Dalam & Xemxija Heritage Trail

This morning, we visit Ghar Dalam, the oldest of Malta's monuments. This water-worn tunnel is approximately 15.5m above sea level, 45m deep, and accessible for about 80m on foot. Here, large quantities of Pleistocene faunal remains (including dwarf hippos and elephants) were found, together with evidence for the earliest known human activity on the island. In the afternoon, we will explore **Xemxiia**. Here, we will also see the Romano Punic apiaries built into a natural cave recess. The honeycombs would have hung in vertical panels in their small chambers within easy reach of the beekeepers.

Day Six | Gozo

We take the short crossing by ferry to Gozo, associated by locals with Homer as the island home of Calypso, Odysseus' temptress and captor. The pace of life is slower here and the landscape is greener. We spend all day on the island where we see Gġantija, a prehistoric megalithic complex of exceptional grandeur; the Xaghra Stone Circle a

Day One | UK - Paris - Poitiers

We take the Eurostar to Poitiers via Paris. Upon arrival, we drive to the village of Angles-sur-l'Anglin where we see **Roc-aux-Sorciers**.

Day Two | Poitiers - Les Eyzies

This morning we head to Les Eyzies, making some important stops along the way. Our first is to the excellent **Museum of Prehistory** at Lussac-les-Chateau, dedicated to the local prehistory. We continue to **Roc-de-Sers** and **La Chaire à Calvin**, a rock shelter decorated with monumental parietal sculptures.

Day Three | Cap Blanc & Font de Gaume

We begin at the rock shelter of Cap Blanc, a rare example of Ice Age sculpted bas-reliefs and the best still in situ which are open to the public. After lunch we visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Font de Gaume, the Musée de la Préhistoire and finally the Musée de l'Abri de Cro-Magnon.

Day Four | Le Thot & Lascaux IV centre and Lascaux II cave

This morning we visit the Lascaux IV centre and then its on to the park of Le Thot. We have an independent lunch in Montignac, before dedicating the afternoon to the Lascaux II cave.

Lascaux is the most famous and spectacular of all decorated caves, with hundreds of paintings and 1,500 engravings, best known for its awe-inspiring depictions of aurochs, horses and deer.

Day Five | Grotte de Rouffignac & Abri du Poisson

We travel by electric train into the cave system of **Rouffignac**. Known as the Cave of the Hundred Mammoths, about one-third of all mammoth depictions known are found in this cave. Our next stop is the the fascinating site of **Laugerie Haute** before ending our day at the small rock shelter known as **Abri du Poisson**.

Day Six | Cougnac & Pech Merle

Our first visit is to **Cougnac**, two caves are found here which contain the claw-marks of cave bears and fascinating stalactite and stalagmite formations. We continue to **Pech Merle**, with painted black outlines of aurochs, mammoth, spotted-horses, geometric shapes and handprints.

Hidden Paris

Peek beyond the famous landmarks and explore the secret archaeology



The tree-lined boulevards, elegant architecture and cobbled riverbanks along the silvery Seine have made Paris one of the most recognisable and romantic cities in Europe. First-time visitors are understandably impressed by its historic monuments, but peek beyond the famous landmarks and you will see another side of Paris to which only the most curious are privy.



Explore the Conciergerie, formerly part of the palace complex but repurposed during the Revolution as tribunal and prison

Admire the architectural masterpiece of Sainte Chapelle, one of the greatest examples of Gothic art

Enjoy the ultimate hidden attraction – the subterranean Catacombes de Paris

Day One | UK - Paris

We depart from London aboard the Eurostar, and glide into the Gare du Nord. After checking in to our hotel, we gather for an exploration of the historic **Marais** district, where a 12th-century fortress remains tucked away among its streets.

Day Two | Sainte Chapelle & Musée de Louvre

This morning we visit the **Île de la Cité**. This area of Paris is home to many famous sites, but our goal is the infamous Palais de Justice and hidden within it, **Sainte Chapelle**. This architectural masterpiece was built to accommodate holy relics acquired by Louis IX in 1239 and it ranks as one of the greatest examples of Gothic art in France alongside the cathedrals of Notre Dame and Chartres. We continue to the **Conciergerie** before ending the day at the **Musée de Louvre**.

Day Three | Egouts & Saint-Germain-en-Laye

We make an unusual visit to the **Egouts**, a complex network of tunnels which mirror the city streets. The sewers have long been an unusual attraction for visitors and guided tours were conducted by boat or wagon as early as the 19th century. Later, we head to the leafy suburbs of Saint-Germain-en-Laye, and the **National Archaeological Museum**.

Day Four | Sacré Coeur & Musée de Montmartre

We head to Montmartre in the 18th arrondissement. This hilltop right bank neighbourhood with its narrow alleys and cobbled lanes retains some of the famous village atmosphere that appealed so much to the artists of the 19th and 20th centuries. Here we visit the snow-white confection of Sacré Coeur and the nearby unsung gem, the Church of St.

Pierre. There is a Roman temple to Mars tucked away within its holy grounds and we admire the spolia repurposed within the church. We end the

Day Five | Arènes de Lutèce & Catacombes de Paris

day at the Musée de Montmartre.

We explore the city's Romano-Gallic origins with a visit to the **Arènes de Lutèce**, site of the Roman amphitheatre. Built in the 2nd century AD, it was designed to seat up to 15,000 people. In the afternoon we visit the **Musée de Cluny** where we visit the Roman baths that lurk beneath the museum. We end the day with a visit to the **Catacombes de Paris**. After several years of modernisation and accessibility work, the museum reopened in May 2022 with a brand new museography.

Day Six | Paris - UK

We leave Paris behind and return to the UK.

A few days in Nice, celebrated for its captivating azure coastline, could easily be spent simply people-watching and enjoying its world-famous promenade. Yet, 2,000 years ago, this playground of the rich was situated on the major highway from Gaul to Rome, the Via Julia Augusta, and its surrounds are therefore rich in archaeology and ancient ruins, serving as a wonderful base for a relaxed exploration of the Côte d'Azur.

Day One | UK - Nice

We fly from London Gatwick to Nice and transfer to our hotel.

Day Two | Nice & St. Jean Cap Ferrat

This morning we explore the extensive archaeological zone in Nice in the Cimiez neighbourhood, visiting the ruins of the amphitheatre and bath complex and visit the Archaeological Museum. In the afternoon we drive to the charming St. Jean Cap Ferrat to discover the villa and gardens of Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild. This glorious pale pink villa, now a museum, contains the eclectic collections of the Baroness de Rothschild and some of the artefacts associated with Marie-Antoinette, including paintings by Monet and Renoir.

Day Three | Fréjus

Today we enjoy a lovely drive east along the coast to the pretty town of Fréjus. Formerly Forum Julii, this small town was one of Caesar's colonies and served as a naval port until the 5th century. We see the Arènes de Fréjus, the late 1st century AD amphitheatre, the remains of the aqueduct, the Porte des Gaules, the best-preserved of the four gates that once marked the city's Roman enclosure, and the excellent Archaeological Museum. Before returning to Nice we also visit the lovely 13thcentury cathedral.

Day Four | Beaulieu-sur-Mer

This morning, we drive to Beaulieu-sur-Mer, once a popular winter resort for the international elite. Here we visit Villa Kerylos, a recreation of an ancient Greek villa from the time of Pericles, complete with period furniture, frescoes and mosaics. Afterwards we ascend to the Trophée des Alpes, a 7th-century monument bult in 6BCE to celebrate the victory of Emperor Augustus over the mountain tribes. Our afternoon is free to either explore more locally or relax back at our hotel.

Day Five | Nice

Today is free to explore as you wish. Stroll along the Promenade des Anglais, visit some of the wonderful galleries and city museums or wander the Old Town, where boutiques offer everything from handmade fruit jellies to antique chinoiserie.

Day Six | Albintimilium & Ventimiglia

We cross the border into Italy today, where we visit the Roman town of Albintimilium. The remains of this ancient Roman city date back to the 1st century AD and bear witness to a time when this part of Liguria was an important cultural and economic centre in the Roman Empire. Later, we continue to Ventimiglia to visit the archaeological museum, housed in the majestic Fort Annunziata with a spectacular view of the town and the coast.

Day Seven | Nice - UK

We return to Nice Airport for our flight back to London Gatwick.



Nestled in the picturesque Moselle Valley, Trier was an important provincial capital in Roman times, known as Augusta Treverorum; it was the residence of emperors, a centre of trade and the largest market in an ancient wine-growing area. Today, still surrounded by vineyards, this ancient city boasts an extraordinary concentration of remarkably preserved Roman monuments, earning it UNESCO World Heritage status.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS

Explore the extraordinary Aula Palatina and Porta Nigra, late antique sites which are largely intact

Admire the gladiator mosaic at the Villa Nennig, which depicts bloody scenes from the arena

Discover the region's Celtic origins at Otzenhausen, one of the largest Celtic hillforts in the world

Day One | UK - Luxembourg - Trier

We begin our journey, flying from London Heathrow to Luxembourg. En route to Trier, we stop at the recently re-opened villa near Echternach, a lavish Roman residence once boasting up to 70 rooms and featuring a reconstructed Roman garden. Upon arrival in Trier, we settle into our hotel and, if time permits, enjoy an exploratory walk.

Day Two | Trier

Our day in Trier starts with the iconic Porta Nigra, the best-preserved 3rd-century Roman city gate north of the Alps, later transformed into two churches. Next, we visit the Cathedral, Germany's oldest church, and the Cathedral Museum, showcasing 4th-century ceiling paintings. After lunch, we explore the Aula Palatina, a vast basilica built by Emperor Constantine, originally heated by a hypocaust system.

Day Three | Trier

This morning, we explore the Rheinisches Landesmuseum, home to Germany's finest ancient artefacts. Highlights include the Trier gold hoard depicting 29 imperial family members and the Neumagen wine ship, a funerary decoration for a wealthy wine merchant. In the afternoon, we visit the Imperial Baths and the amphitheatre, which once hosted 20,000 spectators for gladiatorial contests. We conclude the day with a wine tasting, savouring Moselle Rieslings renowned for their depth of flavour and light alcohol content.

Day Four | Nennig & Borg

Heading south of Trier, we pause at the Igeler Saeule, a 30-metre memorial to the Secundinii family of cloth merchants. At the Roman Villa at Nennig, we admire foundation walls, peristyle remains, and its striking mosaic depicting arena scenes. In the afternoon, we visit the Roman Villa at Borg, excavated in the 1980s and reconstructed in the 1990s.

Day Five | Trier

Today is at leisure to further explore Trier. Options include visiting lesser-known Roman sites like the Viehmarkt Baths or Barbara Baths, exploring the Karl Marx birthplace museum, or enjoying a boat trip on the Moselle.

Day Six | Otzenhausen - Otrang

We visit the Otzenhausen Hillfort, the largest Celtic hillfort of its kind, built by the Treveri tribe. We explore its ramparts and the replica Celtic village at Keltenpark. After lunch, we head to Otrang, a Roman manor complex featuring baths, a heating system, and a temple area.


Day Seven | Trier – Luxembourg - UK

Our final day takes us to the Luxembourg National Museum of History and Art, showcasing archaeological finds from Dalheim (Ricciacus) and Titelberg. After some free time exploring Luxembourg's historic Old Town, we return to the airport for our flight back to London Heathrow.

We also look at the chapel over the north gate and the baptistry, which was once a Temple of Jupiter. This afternoon is free to spend as you wish.

Day Four | Trilj & Klis Fortress

This morning, we drive north to visit the remains of **Trilj** in the Cetina River valley. Known as Tilurium in antiquity, it was the site of an important military garrison and guarded crucial Roman roads. After lunch, we continue to **Klis Fortress**, which commanded one of the most vital strategic passes in Dalmatia for millennia, and throughout the early medieval period served as a royal castle and a pivotal seat for Croatian dukes and kings.

Day Five | Split & Salona

We explore the lives of ordinary people in the **Archaeological Museum**, which contains artefacts from the Palaeolithic to the Iron Age. Our second site visit is to **Salona**. Its origins are Illyrian, but it was under Roman rule that the ancient city truly flourished. We have a picnic lunch at this lovely site before returning to Split.

Day Six | Split

Today is free to spend as you choose. Take a fast boat to the beautiful island of Hvar and visit the seafront Franciscan monastery; visit the Maritime Museum, Mestrovic Art & Fine Art Galleries or take a stroll along Riva, Split's iconic waterfront promenade.

Day Seven | Trogir

We spend most of the day at the picturesque medieval town and UNESCO World Heritage site of **Trogir**, where Romanesque architecture meets Venetian Renaissance and Baroque fortresses and cathedrals. Day One | UK - Berlin

We fly to Berlin from London Heathrow. In the evening we take a stroll through the heart of Berlin to explore the Prussian city shaped in large part by Frederick the Great. We take in the Opera House, Humboldt University - founded by Frederick William III in the 19th century – and the Memorial at Bebelplatz.

Day Two | Berlin

We spend the morning at Museum Island, the cultural heart of imperial Berlin where we explore innumerable treasures such as the famous bust of Nefertiti at the Neues Museum followed by a visit to PERGAMON, Masterpieces of the Ancient Metropolis and 360° Panorama (the Pergamon Museum is currently closed for refurbishment). After lunch we visit the Jewish Quarter where we see memorials such as the Stumbling Stones and Deserted Room and consider Otto Weidt, who employed blind and deaf Jews to make brooms and brushes, thereby saving them from deportation. The remainder of the afternoon is free to explore at leisure.

Day Three | Berlin - Cecilienhof

We spend the day in Potsdam and visit Sanssouci, Frederick the Great's Rococo private residence that was built in the mid 18th century. We proceed to Cecilienhof, a very different royal palace built by the Hohenzollern during World War I, ironically in the form of an English Tudor manor house.

Day Four | Berlin - Wittenberg

We journey to Wittenberg today to visit a number of World Heritage Sites associated with Luther. These include the Lutherhaus, originally part of the University of Wittenberg, it became Martin Luther's residence and is where he wrote his 95 theses. We also visit the Castle Church, or rather All Saints' Church, where he allegedly nailed his 95 theses to the door and where he is buried. In this town steeped in the reformation, we visit the houses of other figures important to the movement, such as Melanchthon and the painter, Cranach.

Day Five | Berlin - UK

This morning we explore Berlin's famous sites, including the Reichstag. We also visit Brandenburg **Gate**, modelled on the Propylaeum of the Athenian Acropolis and one of the most iconic sites in Berlin. We complete the morning with a visit to 'Checkpoint Charlie', the infamous crossing point between East and West so redolent of the city's Cold War period. Our tour ends this afternoon and we transfer to the airport, where we catch our return flight back to London Heathrow.

Far from being a race of unwashed barbarians, they presided over a trading network which extended from Greenland to Baghdad. Following in the Viking's footsteps, we make our own epic voyage starting in Germany, travelling across Denmark and culminating in Sweden.

Day One | UK - Hamburg - Aarhus

We fly to Hamburg and journey to Aarhus, Denmark, exploring the UNESCO World Heritage sites of Hedeby and Danevirke en route. We continue to Aarhus, our base for the next three nights.

Day Two | Ribe - Jelling - Ravning Enge

Our morning visit is to **Ribe**, Denmark's oldest town, with remains from the 8th century AD. We then see the stone ship setting at Baekka, erected by a chieftain for his mother, Vibrog. In the afternoon, we visit Jelling, a UNESCO site with rune-inscribed stones and burial mounds. We end at Ravning Enge, site of a large Viking bridge.

Day Three | Fyrkat - Lindenhoje

This morning, we explore Fyrkat Fort, a Viking fortress from King Harald Bluetooth's reign. After lunch, we visit **Lindholm Hoje**, a grave site with nearly 700 graves spanning 500 years.

Day Four | Aarhus - Ladby - Copenhagen

We visit the Ladby ship burial, preserved beneath a mound. We tour the **Ladby Museum** before crossing the Great Belt Bridge to Zeeland for a visit to Trelleborg. The annual Viking Festival features 'The Battle of Trelleborg'.

Day Five | Gammel Lejre - Roskilde

We explore Gammel Leire, a royal centre associated with Beowulf. At Roskilde, the Viking Ship Museum displays well-preserved ships excavated from the fjord. We may sail a replica Viking ship before visiting the cathedral, the burial place of Danish royalty.

Day Six | Copenhagen

We visit the National Museum in Copenhagen, showcasing prehistoric and Viking artefacts. The afternoon is at leisure or exploring Copenhagen's historic centre.

Day Seven | Copenhagen - Stockholm

We depart Copenhagen, travelling by train over the Øresund Bridge to Stockholm. The journey reveals landscapes transitioning from countryside to forests and lakes. Arrival in Stockholm is in the late afternoon.

Day Eight | Anundshög & Uppsala

We visit Anundshög, Sweden's largest royal burial mound, then Gamla Uppsala, home to royal burial mounds and the kyrka church. Legends of sacrifices to Norse gods enrich our visit to the Gamla Uppsala Historical Centre.

Day Nine Sigtuna & Stockholm

We visit Sigtuna, founded by Erik the Victorious, with its preserved main street. Back in Stockholm, the Historik Museum showcases gold and silver artefacts and Viking archaeological finds.

Day Ten | Birka

We take a boat to Birka, a UNESCO-listed Viking town on Björkö island. Founded in 750, Birka was a major trading centre. A silver ring with Arabic inscription found here highlights its historical significance.

Day Eleven Stockholm - UK

We explore the Vasa warship and walk around Gamla Stan, Stockholm's medieval Old Town. We then head to the airport for our flight home to London Heathrow.



Later, we head south of Tunis to examine a section of the Carthage aqueduct at Jebel Oust, then explore Oudna, a city founded by Emperor Augustus.

Day Four | Tunis - Dougga

Today is dedicated to the magnificent site of Dougga, perched high on the hill above fertile olive groves. Dougga is one of the oldest towns in Tunisia. Its native ancestry and hillside location resulted in a winding street plan, rather than a typical Roman grid. Here, we visit the theatre and the famous Capitolium. We also explore bath complexes, houses and sanctuaries, all in the kind of peace no longer found at European sites.

Day Five | Bulla Regia

We start at the ancient site of Musti, once a town of some importance but still largely unexcavated before continuing north to Bulla Regia, stopping at Testour, a 17th-century town shaped by Jewish and

Muslim communities fleeing the Spanish Inquisition. After lunch, we explore Bulla Regia, featuring rare, well-preserved subterranean Roman houses.

Day Six | Dougga - Kairouan

We head southwest to the charming site of Thuburbo Majus, originally Punic and later a Roman veteran colony. Highlights include the forum with the Capitolium, Winter and Summer Baths, the Palaestra of Petronius and a notable latrine. We also visit Punic-flavoured temples: the Temple of Baalit and the Temple of Caelestis. In the afternoon, we travel to Kairouan, Tunisia's key religious city, founded by the Umayyads in the 7th century AD.

Day Seven | El Djem

Heading southeast to El Djem, originally the Numidian city Thysdrus, we find a wealthy olive oil hub in the 2nd century AD. Next, we visit the Museum of El Djem, showcasing Tunisia's finest mosaics and Roman townhouse foundations in its gardens. Returning to Kairouan, we explore the Great Mosque and wander through the Medina's winding streets, shops and courtyard houses.

Day Eight | Kairouan - Hammamet

We start in Kairouan at the viewpoint over the Aghlabid pools, 9th-century reservoirs once praised by Arab geographers for their grandeur. Next, we visit the Barber Mosque, the burial site of Abu Zama El Belaoui. In the afternoon, we head north to **Sousse**. The Sousse Museum showcases exceptional mosaics, especially from the Roman period when Hadrumetum thrived through trade. We then continue north to Hammamet.



Day Four | Testour & Dougga

We head west, stopping at **Testour**, established in the 17th century by Jewish and Muslim communities fleeing the Spanish Inquisition. Its architecture showcases Spanish and Mudéjar influences. Continuing to **Dougga**, we explore this iconic Roman site with terraced streets, sweeping

countryside views, and the impressive Corinthian façade of the capitol.

Day Seven | Constantine - Djémila - Setif

We travel west to **Djémila**, a Roman town on a narrow plateau, founded between AD 96–117. After lunch, we visit the **Setif Archaeological Museum**, renowned for its Roman mosaics, including the 'Triumph of Dionysus'.

Day Eight | Setif - Batna

Driving south to Batna, we stop at the **Medracen Royal Tomb**. In Batna, we explore **Lambaesis**, the Third Legion Augusta's military base, with notable structures like its amphitheatre and four-sided arch.

Day Nine | Batna - Timgad - Biskra

We visit **Timgad**, a Roman city founded by Emperor Trajan in AD 100. Driving through the Aurès Mountains, we stop at the gorges of Tighanimine, the canyon of Rhouffi, and the **Balconies of Ghoufi**, with sandstone-carved cave dwellings.

Day Ten | Biskara - Algiers

We spend a relaxing morning at a traditional date Palmerie, learning about the cultivation of dates, a vital part of Biskra's economy. After lunch, we fly to Algiers.



New tomb discoveries in Saqqara including the Tomb of Mehu and the Tomb of Maia

Spend two days in Alexandria; the capital of the Ptolemies, one of the greatest cities of the Hellenistic and Roman world

Day One | UK - Cairo

We depart from London Heathrow and arrive in Cairo – this buzzing, energetic metropolis that is Egypt's extraordinary capital and a city that Egyptians admiringly refer to as 'the Mother of the World'.

Day Two | Saqqara

Today, we embark on a journey to Saggara, a necropolis of immense archaeological significance in Egypt. Our exploration includes the Tombs of Maya and Horemheb, alongside the newly accessible Old Kingdom Tomb of Mehu, featured in the 2020 documentary The Secrets of Saqqara. The afternoon leads us to the Imhotep Museum, freshly reopened after extensive renovations. We conclude our Saqqara adventure with visits to the Tomb of Maia, wet-nurse to Tutankhamun, and the Tomb of **Nemtymes**, both recently reopened to the public.

Day Three | Cairo - Alexandria

Our day commences at the National Museum of Egyptian Civilisation (NMEC), inaugurated in 2017 as the first institution showcasing the breadth of Egyptian civilisation from prehistoric times to the present. Post-lunch, we depart Cairo via the desert road, heading towards Alexandria.

Day Four | Alexandria

Our morning is dedicated to the splendid Graeco-Roman Museum, reopened in 2023 after 18 years of renovation. It exhibits thousands of items,

including those discovered during underwater excavations in the submerged cities of Thonis-Heracleion and Canopus, and the ancient Portus Magnus of Alexandria. In the afternoon, we explore the Bibliotheca Alexandrina, where exquisite mosaics from the Ptolemies' royal palace and the exceptional Manuscripts Museum await us, offering far more than most anticipate.

Day Five | Alexandria - Abu Sir - Cairo

Departing Alexandria's centre, we journey to Abu Sir, ancient Tapaposiris, home to a Ptolemaic temple and a funerary monument inspired by the Pharos, perched on a ridge between Lake Mareotis and the Mediterranean. Recent speculations suggest it might house Cleopatra's elusive tomb. After lunch, we travel back south to Cairo.

Day Six | Giza

We devote the entire day to the Great Egyptian Museum (GEM), located on the Giza plateau with pyramids in view. Initiated over two decades ago, the museum spans 750,000 sqm, featuring 12 exhibition halls and innumerable artefacts. Two halls are dedicated solely to Tutankhamun, displaying nearly all 5,000 objects from his tomb for the first time.

Day Seven | Cairo - UK

We return to Cairo airport for our flight home to London Heathrow.



We journey to **Bukhara**, an oasis city renowned for its architectural marvels. Once part of the Persian Empire, it became an intellectual hub under the Samanids. Highlights include the **Po-i-Kalyan** complex, spared by Genghis Khan for its transcendence. A traditional folk show accompanies dinner tonight.

Day Nine | Bukhara

We visit **Poykent**, a predecessor to Bukhara, abandoned due to the drying Zarafshan River. After a picnic lunch, we return to Bukhara for further exploration and leisure time.

Visit a selection of fascinating regional museums, which house exhibitions that showcase the likes of wooden carvings and the Chichorro Mummies

Day One | UK - Santiago

We take an overnight flight from London Heathrow to Santiago.

Day Two | Santiago

Arriving in the morning, we transfer to the hotel for an early check-in. After resting, we regroup for lunch and visit the Museo de Arte Precolombino, renowned for its collection of Latin American antiquities.

Day Three | Santiago - Arica

This morning, we travel to Vina del Mar to visit the Museo de Arqueologia e Historia Francisco Fonck, then we explore Valparaiso, a city built on hills creating a natural amphitheatre overlooking the sea, known as the 'Jewel of the Pacific'. Following dinner, we take a late flight to Arica.

Day Four | Arica - Azapa Valley

Today, we delve into the culture and history of the Chinchorro people. In the morning, we visit **Colon** 10, San Miguel Archaeological Museum, home to the famous Chinchorro Mummies and cross the Azapa Valley to view vivid rock art depicting human figures.

Day Five | Arica - Iquique

Our journey through the Atacama Desert includes stops at Tiliviche and Chiza and we explore El Gigante del Atacama.

Day Six | Iquique

This morning, we relax with a boat trip into the Pacific from Iquique harbour and after lunch, we tour the 'ghost town' of Humberstone.

Day Seven | Iquique - San Pedro de Atacama After breakfast, we drive to Cerros Pintados, visit

Quillagua and its museum and head to San Pedro de Atacama.

Day Eight | Yerbas Buenas & San Pedro de Atacama

We drive to Yerbas Buenas to see petroglyphs by the Atacameño people, depicting alpacas, llamas, and other animals.

Day Nine | San Pedro de Atacama - Santiago

We spend the morning in the Valle de la Luna, admiring its wind-carved formations and salt lakes.

Day Ten | Santiago - Easter Island

We fly to Easter Island, beginning our exploration with a walk around Hanga Roa.

Day Eleven | Easter Island

Our day starts at Ahu Tahai where we visit the Museo Antropologico Sebastian Englert to learn about moai and their discoverers. In the afternoon, we explore sites like Ahu Vaihu and Akahanga.

Day Twelve | Rano Raraku & Papa Vaka

We visit Rano Raraku, then Tongariki, the largest Ahu with the heaviest re-erected moai. After lunch, we view marine petroglyphs at Papa Vaka.

Day Thirteen | Rano Kau, Vinapu & Puna Pau

We explore Hanga Piko and Ana Kai Tangata, then visit Rano Kau and Orongo ceremonial village. We see Vinapu platforms and the Puna Pau quarry, known for red stone top-knots.

Day Fourteen | Easter Island - Santiago

Visit Te Pito te Kura and Ahu Nau Nau, then fly back to Santiago.


